## **Corpus Christi 2018**

21 young members of our parish community will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation on Sunday, the feast of Corpus Christi.

As a young girl preparing for Confirmation in 1960's Scotland, much was made of "being a soldier of God". The Holy Ghost, as the Spirit was referred to back then, seemed a rather scary incarnation to me and I was a little bit worried about becoming a soldier, aged 10.

Age, prayer and personal experience, as well as the Life in the Spirit course offered at St. Michael's a few years ago, have helped me to recognise the deeper meaning of this precious gift in guiding me to become a channel for the Holy Spirit, rather than a soldier!

'If you know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!' Luke 11:9-13
