Today's gospel foreshadows what Jesus will go through as the Son of God, so He can save humanity. He is the son in the gospel who goes to collect the produce from the vineyard of his father and is killed by the tenants. Jesus obeyed willingly, knowing He was to die.

The Jewish authorities would have recognised themselves in the story from Jesus. They are the ruffianly tenants, mistreating the messengers and killing the son.

Jesus warns them:

"The kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit".

There is no such thing as fairness in bargaining with God, which is hard for us to understand. However any reward we earn is totally in God's gift to us. He wants us to work in His vineyard because we love Him and He loves us.

"I chose you from the world to go out and bear fruit, fruit that will last."

St.Gregory the Great said:

"Many are called but few are chosen. Many people follow God with their voices but flee from Him by their conduct."

This is terrifying, as how can we be sure we will be chosen? We pray that God will heed our petitions and give us the graces needed to live a good life in this world. By asking for His and His Blessed Mother's help we will gain all the strength we need to live our lives as good examples to all around us. We sincerely hope that we have enough courage to live as God wishes and not disappoint Him by our conduct.
