Thought for the Week 8th December 2019 2nd Sunday in Advent

The readings for this Sunday couldn't be better for the week ahead as we face another general election, and all the clamour and triumphalism it brings. More than ever, we need 'a spirit of wisdom and insight, a spirit of counsel and power, a spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.'
