Do not lose heart...

The readings on the First Sunday of Advent warned us to be ready, to be on our guard, as we don't know when the end will be. Continuing that theme of preparation, last week's readings were urging us to repent. This Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent is also known as *Gaudete Sunday* — Gaudete meaning 'Rejoice!' So, does that mean that we can pack up the idea of being alert and repentant? Been there, done that, move on? I don't think so.

Advent is a season of anticipation, waiting for the joyful news of the birth of Him who is to be our salvation. "Be patient, brothers, until the Lord's coming." (James 5:7). But we do have to do our bit and that means trying our best to be even slightly worthy of salvation. We show gratitude (real or pretend!) for gifts given us by friends; how much more should we show genuine, heart-felt gratitude for the gift above all others? As the years pass, is there a danger that we become complacent? By the grace of God, we've lived through so many Christmases; it can be easy to take for granted the true message of Christ's Nativity.

So, no, we must not forget to be alert, to be repentant, to behave as if each day is our last. It can sound daunting, which is perhaps why the Church gives us this little mid-Advent fillip – Rejoice! Take heart! Have hope!

With the situation in our country and our world, hope is not currently the easiest feeling to muster – but, as Christians we persevere. We do what we can; we pray – for ourselves and for others; we trust; we hope – and the rest we leave in the hands of God. Isaiah sums it up for us:

"Courage! Do not be afraid. Look your God is coming, [...] he is coming to save you."

Gaudete, my friend – wait with patience. One day we will see the end of 'sorrow and lament.'
