Thought for the Week 11th September, 2022 24th Sunday in Ordinary time

When I was 21, I spent some time in a L'Arche Community in Kerala in India. My nephew was asking me about it this morning. There was no electricity or gas — we cooked using methane from the cows we kept; we went to bed when it got dark and got up when the sun rose. There was no piped water — but we had a well which was deep and full, and we could draw water when we needed to wash or cook. Life was very simple. The building was on a hill above the India Ocean and (apart from the middle of the day) the sea breezes kept us cool.

I am not recommending that we all go back to that way of life and I'm sure if I had been there longer, I would have begun to get frustrated and find it difficult and restrictive to live in that way. But as we enter the second week of The Season of Creation (finishing on the Feast of St Francis, 4th October), and I reflect on the prodigal son and how many things we put between ourselves and God, I remember how much easier it was in those few weeks at Nandi Bazaar, to feel the presence of God and to feel close to the Earth. With our complicated lives, we are pulled this way and that: our needs and wants are complicated, perhaps more complicated than they have to be.

The prodigal son had put so many things between him and his father – first of all, his own ambitions and his need to get away and live out his own desires, and then his shame and remorse at what he had done, but the solution was simple and his father was waiting for him with open arms when he turned back to him, in fact he was looking out for him.

As I reflect on our relationship with God's creation, I am reassured by the story of the simple strong embrace of the father for his child. I believe God's embrace will pull us closer to him. I sometimes feel Creation is calling out to us to remember that embrace. Let's use this Season of Creation to listen to the whisper of that call.
