**Thought for the week**  
Sunday, 13th August, 2020  
24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 18: 21-35

Fr Michael introduced last Sunday's readings by telling us they were about family bust-ups. Well this week's readings are about forgiveness.

*"Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us"*  
"How often" asks St Peter: Jesus answers; *"Not seven, I tell you but seventy-seven times"* In other words a countless number.

CS Lewis in his book "Mere Christianity" suggests:  
*"Everyone says forgiveness is a lovely idea until they have something to forgive."* We all have grudges, but how ready are we to forgive?"

With the 75th Anniversary of the ending of the war, we have had remarkable accounts of forgiveness, but one that remains outstanding is Corrie ten Boom. Her autobiography "The Hiding Place" describes how her Dutch family helped the Jews to escape, but one day they were caught and were imprisoned.

After the war, she describes meeting a guard from the camp who was instrumental in her sister's death, and how difficult it was to shake his hand: but with a prayer to Jesus to help her to forgive him, she managed to lift her arm and found a current passing through her arm and a love for the guard.

Inspired by her sister's example of selfless love and forgiveness amid extreme cruelty and persecution, Corrie established a post-war home for other camp survivors trying to recover from the horrors they had escaped. She went on to travel widely as a missionary, preaching God's forgiveness and the need for reconciliation.

Our disagreements and problems with families, friends and neighbours seem so small in comparison.

Forgiveness of each other is inextricably linked with the forgiveness from our Heavenly Father.

*"Forgive us our Trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."*
