THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - FROM FR COLIN

1600 years ago there were riots on the streets of Constantinople. But the people weren't rioting over a political issue or an economic matter or a social crisis. They were rioting over the Trinity, over different understandings of the Trinity. If only there was that much passion today about the faith we have and the God in whom we believe!

Because at the heart of discipleship is our relationship with Jesus who is the Christ. And the belief which unites all Christian denominations is that Jesus is much more than a good man, so much more than a prophet, that he doesn't just point the way to God but that he IS the way to God, and that he is that for the simple reason that he IS God.

And he's one of us.

As Christians we don't merely follow a prophet, a preacher of a message, a giver of rules: our faith, our baptism, is about something more enormous than that: we stand in the heart of the Blessed Trinity because we stand with Jesus. And so this Sunday is about who we are and who we're meant to be - people made in the image and likeness of God who is Trinity, who is communion. Our belief in the Trinity is a declaration of faith in God whose very being is relationship, whose very being is love, whose very nature is self-giving. And that says so much about who we're meant to be. We live in a world in which unbridled selfishness is so common. And in contrast to that this feast speaks of a God whose inner life is opened in love to the world in the incarnation, in the selflessness, suffering and death of the Word made flesh, in the flooding life-giving outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

This is God. This is who we're meant to be. And the Eucharist proclaims it every time we celebrate it: 'This is my body *given* for you, my blood *poured out* for you.' Today is our 'name day': Trinity Sunday. It names the God we believe in. It calls us to be the face of that God in all that we are and in all that we do: to be in the image and likeness of the Father, who reaches out in merciful love to the world, and the Son, who embraces it, and dies for it, and the Spirit, who graces it.
