Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 18th – 25th January

Just before setting out for the Garden of Gethsemane, where he would be arrested and taken for trial, Jesus prayed:

"I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me." John 17: 20-21.

Our world is in urgent need of receiving and acting on the teachings of Jesus so that it can know justice, integrity and peace, and so have a special care for the poor and marginalised. The apparent disunity amongst Christians must be a stumbling block for some in their journey to Christ. The Holy Spirit unites and brings peace, the devil divides and sows distrust.
