Thought for the week First Sunday of Advent 1st December, 2024

This week begins Advent, a period of hope, of waiting for better things to come.

As we heard during last Sunday's Mass celebrating Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, we are encouraged to reflect on our spiritual journey to date.

We start another new year in the Church's calendar, and have much to look forward to, always with hope.
