## Thought for the week 24th July 2022 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Having come back from camping in Cornwall the day before the heatwave struck, I felt particular resonance in last Sunday's reading from the book of Genesis relating to the The Lord's appearance to Abraham "at the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day.' I wondered how often extreme heat is mentioned in the bible. A quick look revealed dozens of references such as "scorching heat" and 'fever heat' of the sun.

For Jonah and for others, extreme heat was often a time of testing, where the physical challenge pointed to a deeper spiritual crisis that had reached a 'make or break' point.

Our own record-breaking heatwave caused a range of reactions, thousands heading excitedly to the coast, others drawing curtains, pulling down blinds and staying inside, disconcerted that it could become so hot in the UK. Dozens of fire engines tackled bush and forest fires, while in an East London estate many lost their homes and all their possessions in a fast-spreading blaze. Passengers were stranded when air travel was stopped by melted runway tarmac, and trains by heat buckled rail tracks.

One way or another extreme heat stops us in our tracks. Some good may come of this: spontaneous acts of generosity and kindness, such as the businesses that donated cooled water bottles, the churches or social clubs that invited the public in for free drinks and to cool down in their cool or air-conditioned buildings. Some of those who stayed at home used the time to contact family and friends to see how they were coping. Looking back now, with a cool head, we need to consider how we can play our part in reducing the greenhouse gas build-up behind such extreme weather. We have a new group at Church The Thoughtful Living Group who are doing just that.

As the schools close for the summer holidays we pray for pleasant, warm weather and smoothly running airports, railways and roads. But more importantly we ask for God's guidance in making our break from our usual routine become an opportunity to grow closer in love and understanding of one another. Amen.
