The Greatest of these is Love

If you go to a wedding in a church and are inclined to accept a wager, then betting against hearing today's second reading might find you out of pocket! But there is more to the message in that reading than the hope of human matrimonial love.

St Paul tells the Church in Corinth that the Spirit gives gifts to everyone, but different gifts to different people. No one gift is better than any other and their response to God's gifts must be to use them for the purpose of the Kingdom. The same message is true for each one of us today. We all have God-given gifts. We have been given the gifts we need and the gifts that we are called upon to use. Some of us may be healers or preachers or teachers; we may be carers or administrators or helpers: these gifts have no hierarchy – what is important is that we use them.

The power that we are given behind all of these gifts to help us to make the best use of our talents or gifts are three things: Faith, Hope and Love. The Spirit helps our faith to be active, it allows our hope to persevere and above all gives us the strength to love unsparingly.

My prayer for this week is for me to truly understand the gifts that I have been given for use in the here and now. And then I pray for my faith to be alive and active, my hope to remain strong and for the love of Christ to be in everything I do and be shared with all those I meet.
