THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Today, we hear the parable of the Prodigal Son from the Gospel of Luke . This story is a profound illustration of God's boundless mercy and the joy of reconciliation.

In the parable, we hear about a father with two sons. The younger son asks for his share of the inheritance and squanders it in reckless living. When a severe famine strikes, he finds himself in dire need, even longing to eat the pods fed to the pigs. Realising his mistake, he decides to return to his father, hoping to be accepted as a hired servant. As the son approaches, his father sees him from a distance and is filled with compassion. He runs to his son, embraces him, and kisses him. Despite the son's confession of unworthiness, the father orders his servants to bring the best robe, a ring, and sandals for him. He also calls for a celebration, saying, "This son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found". The older son, by contrast, struggles with resentment and jealousy, unable to understand his father's joy.

The parable highlights that, no matter how far we stray, God is always ready to welcome us back with open arms. His forgiveness is not based on our worthiness but on His infinite love for us. However, I find I can sympathise with the elder brother. He was stuck with the feeling that his thoughtless younger sibling was being rewarded for behaving badly. He felt that something was owed in recompense, and it prevented him seeing a positive way forward as a family united.

At this turbulent time around the world, it feels very much as if this very human reaction to dispute may be gaining strength. Successful resolution of conflicts, in Ukraine and Gaza, will rely on parties being generous and forgiving. Neighbours must be willing to look beyond past misdeeds and to look forward with hope. Let us pray that our world leaders may be inspired by the unconditional love and mercy of God, illustrated in this parable, to seek solutions in good faith and not conditional on demeaning reparations or hollow flattery.
