Thought for the week 3rd July 2022 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week we celebrated the feast of St Peter and St Paul. Two huge characters in the journey our church made as they began its ministry to the world, emboldened by the essence of Christ its friend, who assured them that He would ALWAYS be with this new church, until the end of time.

At this moment, in this very troubled and sometimes scary world we are living in, I find it very easy to lose heart in Our Blessed Lord's words to Peter and Paul. Many things are getting worse and many people are dying, so things look bleak; we can begin to doubt that our prayers are being answered. However Peter and Paul did not falter in their faith, even in their dangers. Therefore we need to become like them and try to be positive. We know that our prayers are always listened to, and they are answered in God's way NOT OURS.

Let us pray constantly that we can let go our own fears and doubts and let God work in our hearts and lives. Pray that we can show a Christian face to the world and allow God to work through us.

We need to be like St Peter and St Paul. Try not to get dissuaded from the path to heaven we are walking. Do not deviate from our belief that we are on a journey and our destiny is to be with God forever. Try not to feel sorry for ourselves but reach out to others, so that by small example we can influence others to turn to prayer and TRUST in God.

James Hudson Taylor, a Protestant founder of the China Inland mission said:
