THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

The Road to Emmaus is one of my favourite and inspiring stories from the New Testament.

At school our sixth form house was called Emmaus House and was apart from the rest of the school buildings. It was a grand Regency house with stunning views over the whole city of Bristol from the Clifton Suspension Bridge designed by Brunel. It had a peaceful feeling and lovely garden and it fostered a love of serenity within us. After the school had closed (as it was not financially viable without all its 11-plus pupils) Emmaus House become a well-known retreat centre, while the school and convent became a hospice for cancer care. The feeling of serenity and love continued.

As students several of us felt "the power of being shown the path of life".

The presence of the convent also fostered this faith.

The two disciples in the story today are distraught at the loss of their best friend and leader. They are astounded that this Man has not heard of all the terrible happenings. The death of Jesus left them feeling hopeless as they "hoped He was the one to redeem Israel"

Jesus chastises then for not knowing what the prophets had foretold and explains the scriptures for them. They are impressed and ask Him to stay and eat with them. It is while he is breaking the bread and blessing it that He allows them to realise who He is.

"And their eyes were opened and the recognised Him"

We pray that we would also be able to discern a truth from a stranger and realise we are being given a truth about faith.

Jesus walks beside us always on our journey. Faith and reflection help us discover that life is hopeless without God. He helps us make good life choices. The Holy Spirit guides us. Let us listen to those we meet and maybe hear the will of God in their words and friendship.

"Lord Jesus open the Scriptures and make our hearts burn within us when you speak to us"

Let our prayer constantly be

- "Oh Lord show me the path of life"
- We are on our own Road to Emmaus.
