Thought for the Week 2nd Sunday of Lent 5th March 2023

Bear the hardships...

We've arrived at the Second Sunday of Lent: how are your Lenten resolutions going? Pretty well, it is to be hoped - if we heeded Fr Michael's suggestion to set ourselves achievable targets to include prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

People who don't share our Faith can be confused by the whole notion of 'giving something up'; they can't see the point. Maybe we could help to un-confuse them by explaining that we need to learn to resist what we might call minor temptations (to eat chocolate, drink wine, watch TV, etc), so that when major temptations come our way, we are better-equipped to turn away from them. We're able to flex our muscles of resistance.

This is fine in principle, but we need help – and we are blessed to have that in the example of Our Lord. His training took place in the desert and when Satan arrived to tempt Him, Our Lord was well able to deal with him. Jesus, the human Man, must surely have felt physical weakness after 40 days of fasting, and it occurs to me that His strength in batting away the Devil's temptations came from His knowledge of Scripture, which He quoted as an answer to each snare. So, one weapon in our Lenten armoury could be to increase our scriptural reading.

Prayer is also a key requirement of Lent. Its importance in the fight against temptation was underlined by Jesus Himself, who urged His disciples in Gethsemane to "pray that you may not enter into temptation" (Lk 22:40).

Finally, remember to trust in the Lord; we are not alone. As Timothy says,

"Bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God who has saved us...".
