THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Love, Love, Love...

It is said that the Inuit people have over 50 words for snow. I don't know how true this is and, unless you speak the Inuit language, it probably doesn't matter much to you or me. What does matter is that the Greeks had four words for Love. More properly, they had four words for four types of love that, in English, we use that single word for. In today's Gospel, from St John, we hear the start of the sermon Jesus gives to the gathered disciples at the Last Supper. The words we read are probably taken by the evangelist from several passed on oral recollections; but from the beginning and the teaching he repeats throughout his Gospel is of love being a key foundation of Jesus' message and our Christian faith.

The new commandment: "just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another" and that, by this sign others will recognise that they (and we) are His disciples, is a use of the Greek agape ($\dot{\alpha}\gamma\dot{\alpha}\pi\eta$). Agape, to Greek speakers, was the highest form of love; the selfless and unconditional love that God has for humanity. This is the love that St Paul also calls us to in the beautiful passage in his first letter to the Church in Corinth. The love that is always: patient and kind, never envious, boastful or proud....

The second type of love that we as Jesus' followers are called to is philia $(\varphi \iota \lambda i \alpha)$; the mutual love and respect that is the basis for true and deep friendship between individuals. At the extreme this love is so great that someone would "lay down his life for his friends".

The other two facets of love as understood by the Greeks are: eros ($\xi \rho \omega \zeta$) and storge ($\sigma \tau o \rho \gamma \dot{\eta}$). Eros describes romantic or passionate love, whilst storge refers more to the bonds of love within families.

A prayer for each one of us this week, for those we love and especially for those who feel lonely or abandoned:

May you love, may you be loved and may you feel loved. And may the love of Christ our risen saviour, dwell in your heart for ever.
