Thought for the week 27th Sunday of the Year (B) 6th October, 2024

The readings this weekend develop Christ's teaching on family and community. There is an African proverb –

"it takes a village to raise a child". Children are important — they are the future.....our future.

Now that our own children have grown up and are living their own lives, we have a bit more time and we have been researching the history of our own families. This has been made a bit more difficult since it has become evident that a hundred years ago it was very common for the extended family to help with childrearing. Children often went to live with aunts, uncles and grandparents in periods when their parents encountered hard times.

Throughout the Bible there are similar images of community and family strength including the escape of the Israelites from Egypt, the flight of the Holy Family from Herod and the fledgling Christian community after the first Pentecost. The drive for the preservation of families is very strong.

In current conflicts, pictures of whole families and sometimes whole communities abandoning their homes and lives to become refugees in their own or another country appear on our screens regularly. The negative effects on family life and children's well being are long-lived and well documented.

This weekend a group of St Michael's parishioners are hoping to do a "Ramble for Refugees". (weather permitting) This has at least two benefits. The ramblers will spend time together in a common activity talking to those we do not see very often as we attend different masses or live in different areas of the parish. It is also hoped that the walk will raise some money and awareness for the Refugee Centre in Reading.

Increasing the strength of a community can benefit not only those at home but gives more opportunity to reach out to those in need – even in villages far away from Sonning Common.
