THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - FROM FR COLIN

'Peace I bequeath to you, my own peace I give to you'.

Peace. Everyone seeks it. So few seem to find it. And yet here we have Jesus promising this as one of the marks of an Easter People. I think that the problem can be that we ourselves put quite a few obstacles in the way of us having peaceful hearts - and one of those ways is that we spend so much of our energy living in the future.

It can happen when we subtly, or not so subtly, base our happiness on 'ifs' and 'whens', when our present gives centre stage away to some ideal future when things will be 'just so': the finishing of study, the bigger and better house, the perfect job. Something different for each of us.

The problem of course is that we can't live in the future, only where we are now. And so perhaps much of the lack of peace of soul that fills our modern life can come from not being able to find the grace in the present, from giving too much of our psychic, spiritual, energy to what isn't, rather than to what is.

Easter says that there is always grace around us. The problem is that too often we don't see it, or perhaps we don't want to see it in the form in which it comes. Human beings want grace as they expected it, in the form that delivers what they want. Which is a recipe for discontentment with how things actually are, a recipe for seeing all the moments on the way to those future plans as grace-less.

We've all had the experience of having our eyes so fixed on something in the distance that we trip over what's right in front of us!

Jesus bequeaths us peace, but perhaps all too often we don't find it because the wanderlust of our hearts doesn't allow us to remain in the present and to find the contentment which comes from seeking and being touched by God there.

"Peace I bequeath to you. A peace the world cannot give." A peace the world cannot give because the world teaches us to look for peace outside ourselves and outside the now. Peace lies in recognising the grace and the presence of God in the present moment, however imperfect it is, because the present moment is the only moment we ever have .
