The parable of Lazarus and the rich man (Luke 16:19–31) is a stark reminder of the chasm that can exist between wealth and poverty. Lazarus, destitute and covered in sores, lay at the rich man's gate—perhaps hoping for scraps, mercy, or even recognition. Yet he died unnoticed, uncared for, seemingly forgotten.

Only in death do the tables turn. Lazarus is comforted in heaven, while the rich man suffers. Crucially, the rich man knows Lazarus by name—proof that he had seen him, passed him, and chosen indifference. This is not a story of ignorance, but of neglect.

It raises uncomfortable questions: Does our earthly status blind us to the suffering of others? Are we complicit in systems that perpetuate inequality?

The divide between those with abundance and those in need is not new. But the Gospel calls us to respond—not with guilt, but with action. Our parish continues to work alongside other churches and community groups to support those struggling locally. Globally, we've welcomed missionaries who share stories of communities burdened by poverty and debt. Our CAFOD Champion recently highlighted how some nations are trapped in cycles of repayment to richer countries, unable to invest in their own people.

While we may never fully balance the scales of wealth and poverty, we are called to bridge the gap with compassion. The rich man's regret came too late. Ours need not.

We can choose to see, to act, and to love—now.
