Thought for the week 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time 13th February 2022

On reading this week's Gospel from St Luke, one of the first things to strike me was that Jesus stopped at a level place. I have to admit that I was more familiar with St Matthew's account of the Sermon on the Mount.

In St Luke's Gospel, Jesus has come down from the mountain and is among the people - there, in the midst of those who had come to be healed and to listen to Him. He is with us when the world abandons us, loving us when it seems everyone else hates us. Jesus Himself is the blessing - we need no longer grieve alone, stress alone or worry alone.

I was also struck by the woes juxtaposed with the blessings. Luke is making clear here that if we concentrate only on ourselves, amassing wealth and seeking status as ends in themselves, then our attention has drifted from God

However, as the blessed followers of Christ, our struggle is a temporary state leading to our reward in heaven. Jesus came to lift up the poor and lowly and we find blessing in seeking Him - we are not alone in our experiences and needs, and we cannot leave others alone in theirs.

Jesus himself was denounced and plotted against by the Pharisees, driven out of towns and scorned. If we follow His way: loving our neighbour, showing compassion to those suffering and helping the needy, then we can pray that our struggles will be only temporary and enjoy eternal life in Jesus.
